Madam / Sir,

In continuation to this office letter referred above, it is to inform you that the following assessment structure on Examination of Scholastic area for the classes III to IX and XI received from KVS Hqrs is forwarded for the perusal and necessary action at Vidyalaya level.

- a) Session ending examination for Classes III to V
- Written examination for 80 marks with syllabus covered after half yearly examination.
 - Duration of the examination would be 2 ½ hours
 - Question papers, Blue Print and marking scheme for the examinations will be prepared and evaluated at Vidyalaya level under the strict supervision of the principal.
 - Proper coaching has to be given to the students before the exams
 - The time table has to be prepared at Vidyalaya level and distributed to the students well in time
 - The result has to be declared on 27.03.2018.
- b) Session ending examination for Classes VI to VIII
- The written examination for Classes VI to VIII will be conducted for the Score of 80 marks with the syllabus coverage as below :
 - a) Class VI : 10% of First term syllabus covering significant topics + entire syllabus of Second term
 - b) Class VII : 20% of the first term covering significant topics + entire syllabus of Second term
 - c) Class VIII : 30% of the first term covering significant topics + entire syllabus of Second term

- d) The score of 80 marks for the session ending has to be distributed as 10% for the first term for Class VI (8 marks for first term + 72 marks for term II), 20% for the first term for Class VII (16 marks for first term + 64 marks for term II) and 30% of the first term for Class VIII (24 marks for first term + 56 marks for term II)
- The duration of examination is 2 ½ hours
 - The question papers will be prepared at Regional level and distributed to the Vidyalayas
 - The evaluation has to be carried out at Vidyalaya level
 - The significant topics chosen from Term 1 will be intimated to the Vidyalayas by the Regional Office
 - The chapter-wise weightage of marks will be distributed to the Vidyalayas by the Regional Office and the same should be made available to the teacher and the students
 - It is planned to have a sample checking of answer script at regional level before declaration of results. Hence teachers and checkers are to be informed accordingly.
- c) Session ending examination for class IX
- For class IX CBSE pattern of evaluation will be followed.
 - Maximum Mark will be 80 and the duration of the examination will be 3hrs.
 - The question paper will be prepared at regional level and the evaluation will be at vidyalaya level.
 - Sample checking of the answer script will be executed at regional level for which a separate communication will be sent later.
 - The examination will have cumulative content of both the terms..
- d) Scheme of examination and pass criteria for class XI
- The examination for class XI would be conducted in theory as well as in practical/project depending upon the nature of the subject and the marks allotted, as prescribed in the curriculum
 - The qualifying marks in each subject of external examination shall be 33%. However, in a subject involving practical / project work, a candidate must obtain 33% marks in theory and 33% marks in the practical / project separately in addition to 33% marks in aggregate, in order to qualify in that subject
 - A candidate failing in one of the five subjects of examination at Class XI shall be placed in Compartment in that subject provided he/she qualified in all the subjects of internal assessment (As per CBSE Examination Byelaws Notification dated 29.11.2016 regarding Additions/Amendments in Examination Bye-Laws, para 40.2.)


- A candidate has to appear mandatory in session ending examination to be eligible to be consider for promotion to class XII
- The student has to appear in all the examinations to be declared pass / promoted
- No re-exam shall be conducted except on genuine grounds including medical
- Compartment exam will be held by 10th April and result will be declared before 15th April so that student attend XII from 15th April onwards
- A total of 10 grace marks spread all over the subject with a maximum of 04 marks in one subject can be given to a students who participated in the KVS National Meet / SGFI Meet in that Academic Year. These marks can be given in the column of final weighted score to the extent needed to promote the student and not to bring him/her in the zone of supplementary case.
- The question papers for all subjects will be prepared at Regional level and the evaluation of the elective subjective subject Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Economics, Accountancy and Business Studies (6 subjects) will be at Regional level. However, the other subjects the evaluation will be at Vidyalaya level.

The Cluster conveners of the centralized evaluation process of the chosen SIX elective subjects will be informed shortly.

Co-scholastic activities are to be assessed by TGT (WE), TGT (AE), TGT (P&HE) and others on 3 point/6 point /9 point scales as per the guidelines and relevant records are to be submitted to the exam department for Classes III to XII.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.
